
SCRATCHING THE SURFACE - MATTERS OF PERCEPTION Glass Symposium, Amsterdam 2009

Dear Colleagues & Students,

This year the organisation 'Het Centraal Bureau' together with glass department of the Gerrit Rietveld Academie, Gemeentemuseum Den Haag, and Virtueel Museum, are arranging and hosting the symposium 'Scratching the Surface–Matters of Perception'. The symposium falls in the year of the glass department's 40th anniversery.

The event reaches out to designers and artists, students and teachers from at least 15 different European academies and other interested. The symposium is open to any one with interest. The symposium has previously taken place in Estonia, 2005 and France, 2007.

From the 9th till 11th of October 2009 there will be a three day program which will consist of two series of lectures, videos screenings and the retrospective exhibition entitled "Glas/s - Gerrit Rietveld Academie Amsterdam 1969 – 2009" at The Municipal Museum in The Hague. The symposium will take place in three different locations; Platform 21, Amsterdam, The Municipal Museum The Hague and The Gerrit Rietveld Academy, Amsterdam.

European glass is highly diverse. The glass department at the Gerrit Rietveld Academy has contributed much to the emancipation of glass as a medium for fine art. In this conference we will be focusing on the experimental and free approach to the medium glass, in order to broaden the

students' awareness of various aspects of its artistic use.

Between the two days of lecture series we will run a workshop, created by German artist Ulrike Möntmann, challenging the participant's thoughts of where they stand in the world. During this workshop the participants are investigating their own life and reality for each year of their life in a word-Matrix, in their own native language. The result will be exhibited in the gym of the Rietveld academy.

It is the hope of the organisation that the symposium will encourage the participants to exchange points of views of their own position as artists and as viewers in our time. The symposium "Scratching the Surface – Matters of Perception" will question and emphasize the awareness of individual realities with which we view the world, communicate and interact. Through exploring various aspects of perceptions and unique ways of executing ideas, we wish to explore the borderlines of working in glass and its theoretical possibilities. Another key element is the philosophical questioning of traditions. How do we define them? By breaking them? When does the dispensing of one tradition evolve into a new tradition? Is it the role as artists to challenge traditions in society?

The price per participant is \in 110. - for the three day event, which includes payment for lectures and transport to and from The Hague as well as some dinners and lunches. There is a limited number of 175 participants.
