Re-Arch

Workshop GRA Architectural Design
11-14 april 2011, year 1 and 2
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Reuse of existing buildings is one of the most important architectural tasks of the near future. Not just protected monuments have to be redesigned when the original function has left the building, but also post war apartment blocks, offices and industrial buildings.

In this workshop we will study a complex of five 17^{th} -century based houses at Herengracht which in the 20^{th} century have transformed into a complex office building behind an older facade.

There are some interesting conditions to be dealt with:

- The Grachtengordel (Ring of Canals) of Amsterdam is a listed UNESCO monument since 2010.
- Each building (exterior and interior) is protected as National Monument.

The facades are world famous, but what is behind the facades and what is the potential of these buildings?

Should monuments be 'frozen' in the current state, inside and outside, or is re-arch possible behind the old façade? How important are the facades?

Subject

Herengracht 448-456, currently used by the Deutsche Bank. They will leave the buildings by January 2012

Fit in this program:

- 6.800 m2 office space
- office space is used independently by a minimum of 8 different small companies
- 540 m2 restaurant/private dining/lounge and kitchen
- semi-public use of the outdoor space at the back
